We continue to find new ways to serve our communities and further the mission of National Panhellenic Alumnae groups to promote the fraternity system and stimulate interest in Panhellenic affairs. This year we have added a new scholarship to our budget - in addition to our High School and Collegiate Dues Scholarship we are offering the UIFI Scholarship. This is a scholarship for a current undergraduate Panhellenic woman to attend the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute which is the premier leadership development program for fraternities/sororities. It is a five-day institute that brings together sorority women and fraternity men from across North America to create opportunities to enhance their leadership skills and commitment to their fraternal organization. We have partnered with Northern Illinois University to be able to honor one of their Panhellenic women and hopefully have her be able to bring back amazing knowledge and tools to their Panhellenic community.
